People with intellectual disability have the right to be part of the community like everyone else.

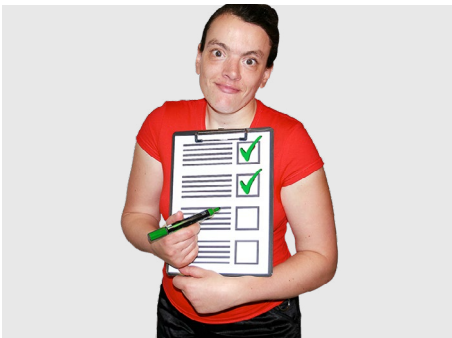


The law says the Government should try to make sure people with intellectual disability

The Australian Government wrote the **Australian Disability Strategy**.



The **Australian Disability Strategy** says what the Government wants to do to make life better for people with disability.



The NSW Government said yes to all the things in the Australian Disability Strategy.



This means they said yes to **disability inclusion**.

**Disability inclusion** means people with disability are part of things like everyone else.

## How are things now



Right now the **Department of Communities and Justice** looks after disability inclusion.

They are called **DCJ** for short.



DCJ is a part of the NSW Government.



They are only 1 part of the NSW Government.



They can not tell other parts of the NSW Government what to do.

# What needs to happen



We want a different part of the NSW Government to do the actions for disability inclusion.



We think it should be the job of the **Department of Premier and Cabinet.**

They are called **DPC** for short.



The DPC works on big changes for the Government.



They work on things that are important to all parts of the NSW Government.



DPC has more power to get things done for people with disability.



They work closer together with the NSW Government to make big changes.



We think DPC can make disability inclusion happen in NSW.
