Some people with disability have a **guardian**.

Guardians are allowed to make decisions when a person cannot make decisions on their own.



A Tribunal decides if a person needs a guardian.

A Tribunal is like a court that can make decisions about people.



Tribunals have a **guardianship hearing** when they make a decision about a person with disability.

Some people with disability are not included in their guardianship hearing.

We think this is wrong.



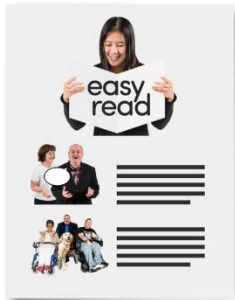
People with disability have a right to be at their guardianship hearing.

They should get support to be at their guardianship hearing.



The people deciding if a person needs a guardian should know about disability.

There should be **at least** 3 people making this decision.



The language in guardianship hearings should be easy to understand.

Documents should be in Easy Read.
