Being part of a panel



You might be asked to be on a **panel**.

A **panel** is a row of people who answer questions from a group.



Each person on a panel knows different things.

They each answer questions about what they know.



Some questions will be for you.



Some questions will be for other people.



If a question is for someone else let them answer first.



Listen to their answer.



You can add more after they finish.

Only if you want to.



Someone else might add more after you have talked too.

Answering questions



People might ask you questions.

It is OK to stop and think about the answer.



You can talk to your supporter before you answer.



This might take time.

That is OK.



It is OK to ask for more information.

It is OK to ask to make the question clearer.



It is OK to choose not to answer it.

Or to answer some parts and not others.



You choose what you answer.

Doing a summary



At the end of training we do a **summary**.

A summary is when you say the main points.



It helps people remember what they learned.

It also helps them understand it better.



Stick to the main points.

This is what you want people to remember.
