

My Rights Matter is part of the Council for Intellectual Disability

We say CID for short



CID is a disability rights organisation



CID

- speaks up on big issues
- gives information
- empowers people and communities



My Rights Matter is about supported decision making

It helps people

- learn about rights
- make decisions
- get support

How our grants work



You can apply for a grant from us



You can apply for between \$1,000 and \$5,000



You can use the money to do a project about supported decision making



Your project must be in NSW



Your project must help more people do supported decision making



You could do an activity



For example

You could start a group to talk about decisions that people in the group are making



You could go to an event



For example

You could go to a conference to talk about supported decision making



You could make something



For example

You could make a video about getting support to make decisions



You can use your imagination to make up your own project



You need to tell us what you want to do in your project



If you get a grant we will tell you the next steps to do your project

Choosing applications




My Rights Matter will choose who to give grants using a selection panel



A selection panel is a group of people who make decisions



The selection panel will decide who to give grants using selection criteria




Selection criteria are the things we are looking for in your application




Our selection criteria are

The person applying is a person with intellectual disability



The application shows a good understanding of supported decision making



The project has clear outcomes that benefit people with intellectual disability and the community. The project

- grows the supported decision making capability of people with intellectual disability
- increases supported decision making awareness and capability within the community



The project is achievable

The person applying has the resources, skills and support to do the project



The project has a clear timeline



The project will start after the project start date and finish by the project end date



The project budget is clear and shows good value for money



The Council for Intellectual Disability makes the final decision about who to give grants
