Referendum means a vote to change the **Constitution**.



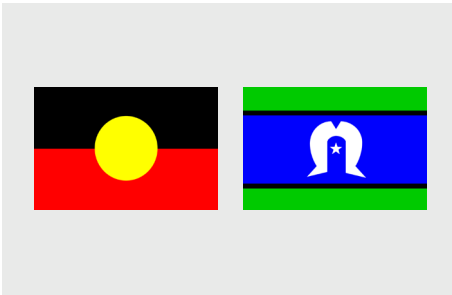
The **Constitution** is a set of rules about how to run Australia.



CID thinks people with disability are the experts in their lives.



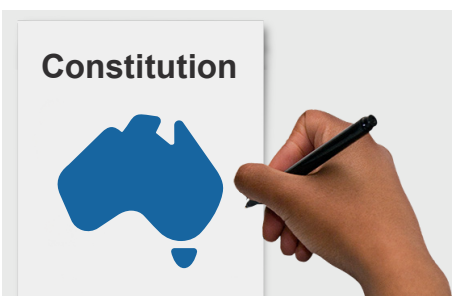
CID thinks **First Nations people** are the experts in their lives too.
