Hello, my name is Jennifer Bur.

I am a researcher. I have questions and I need your help.





What is the research about?

Jennifer would like to hear from people who had planned surgery under general anaesthesia within the **last 5 years**.



Jennifer would like to hear about your experiences:

- BEFORE you go to hospital
- WHEN you are in hospital
- After you came home from hospital



Jennifer would like to look at Health passport, communication books, and other general surgery information so I can better understand your experience.



Jennifer would like to ask some questions about your experiences when you went to hospital and had surgery.



Jennifer will ask, "Can I record this meeting?" It means she can listen to it later. Only Jennifer will listen to the recording.





Jennifer will ask,

- Can you tell me how you felt when ...?
- What was your experiences?
- What would you like changed?

How much time will it take?

The online meeting or face-to-face and will take about 1 hour. The meeting will be at an agreed date, time, and venue. It will be held during the day.



What benefit will I, and the broader community receive by participating?

You will not get direct benefits. Your experiences may help doctors and nurses understand how to better care for other people with intellectual disability when they have inpatient surgery under general anaesthetic in the future.



Will the study involve any risk or discomfort for me? If so, what will be done to rectify it? The meeting will talk about your inpatient surgery experience. The meeting will be audio-recorded.



The researcher will have pictures of general hospital surgical settings that will be used to help Jennifer ask questions. If you need a break the interview will stop.

Will the information gathered be disposed of? The interview recordings and information will be kept locked away and then destroyed in five years after publication.
