One is called I can decide in my language.




This project will work with people who

The Expo will be at the Fraternity Club in Fairy Meadow.




The Expo will be on Tuesday 3 December from 10am to 3pm.

Make sure the centre does inclusion well.




• Work with different teams

There are accessible viewing areas for people with disability.






