This sheet has information about **research** called We are part of development; the implementation of disability policies in Ghana and Australia.

You can ask someone you trust to help you understand this sheet.

What is the research about?



Research is when you try to learn more information about a topic.



The research is being done by Hilda. She is a student at the Australian National University.



This is Hilda.



Hilda's research is about whether the implementation of disability policies in Australia helps people with disability go to the school they want or work at a place they like.



Hilda's supervisor who is called Laura is helping her do her research.

What does taking part in the research involve?




You can take part in the research, if:

- You are 18 years old or above,
- You live in Australia, and
- You have a disability.



You can **take part** by doing an interview. In the interview, you will talk to Hilda.



Hilda will ask you some questions about:

- How you understand disability?
- If people with disability can go to any school, university or training program and choose the courses they want.
- If people with disability can work anywhere they want.
- What can be done to help people with disability in schools, universities or workplaces?



You can choose which questions to answer. You can skip the question if you don't want to answer it.



Hilda will ask you if she can record what you say. If you don't want her to, that is OK. She will take notes instead.



You can talk to Hilda in person, on the phone, or by video call. You can bring someone you trust to help you.



You will talk to Hilda for about 30 minutes to 1 hour. You can take breaks if you need to.

What will happen to my information?



Hilda will store your information in a computer folder owned by her university for five years after the research is published.



Hilda will keep your information private. She will not tell anybody your name or where you live.

No one will know it was you who took part.



Hilda will write about what she finds out. If you want to, she will send you a summary.

Hilda can speak to you to help you understand the summary.

Do I have to take part?



You only have to talk to Hilda if you want to.

You can say no. It's your choice. No one will be angry if you say no.

Even if you say yes, you can change your mind later and stop taking part.
